

Using the imago imaging FTP Server

If you require sending or receiving digital image files from imago imaging you can use our FTP server to do this.

If you send files to Imago Imaging,
please let us know so we can prepare a folder/directory for you to use.

There are several ways you can access the imago imaging FTP server. Below are instructions for accessing the server using common FTP software on the Macintosh and PC as well as instructions to access the server using the command line (used mostly on Unix systems or Macintosh computers using the Terminal application).

On the Macintosh

Image 1a shows a login dialog of a popular FTP client application on the Mac (Transmit).

FTP applications offer the user a dialog to login to remote servers. For the application to the right, you see a pane that contains two areas. On the left are files available from your local machine. On the right is a log-in area.

Use the information in the pane on the right (User Name: anonymous) to log into the imago imaging FTP server.

After you have logged in, you will see files available to you on the remote server.

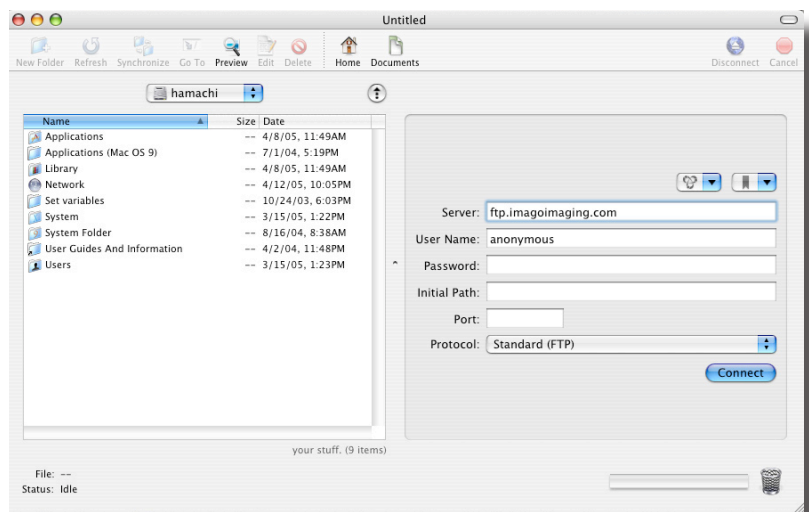


image 1a - Login dialog for Transmit FTP software

| On the PC

Image 2a shows a popular FTP client application on the PC (CuteFTP).

Like the Mac application in the previous page, you are presented with 2 panes in the application window. The left pane displays the files on your computer. The right pane shows files available on the remote FTP server.

Go to "File/New FTP Site" and type in the address of the imago imaging ftp server (ftp.imagoimaging.com) in the "Host address" field. Type "anonymous" as the user name. You do not need a password to access the server.

After you have logged in, you will see files available to you on the remote server.

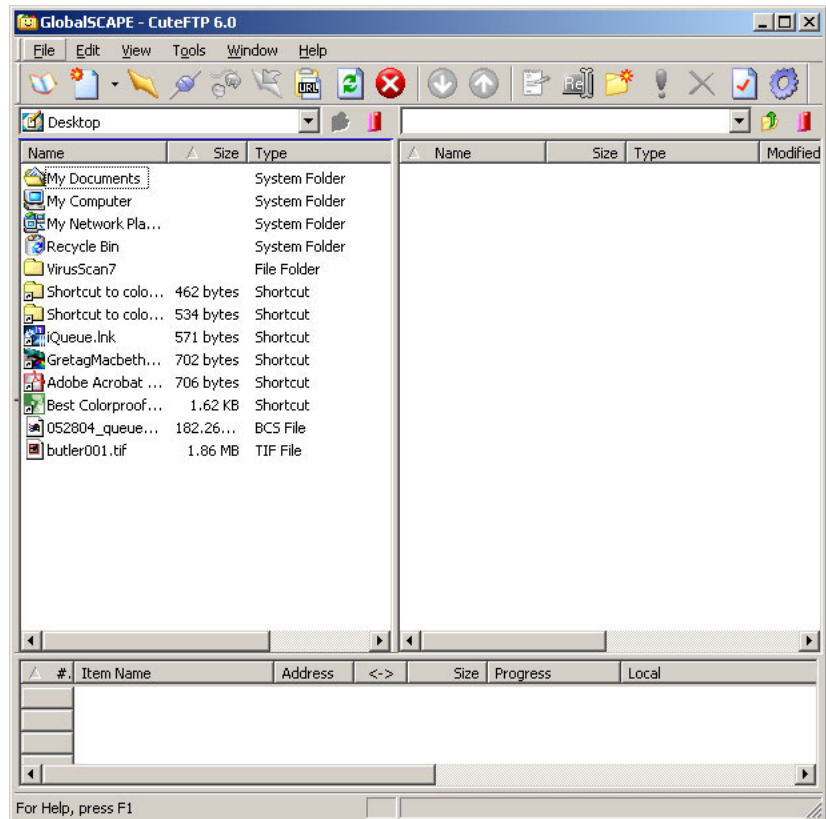


image 2a - Main window for CuteFTP software

I Using a Command Line

You can use a command line to execute applications on the Mac and UNIX platforms.

To use an FTP application in this environment, open your terminal. You should see a command prompt that is similar to what is seen in image 3a.

Type in “ftp ftp.imagoimaging.com” at the prompt (see image to the right).

You will be given prompts to enter your user name and password. Use the user name “anonymous”. You do not need to use a password to access the FTP server.

For more information on FTP from the command line, type “man ftp” at the command prompt.

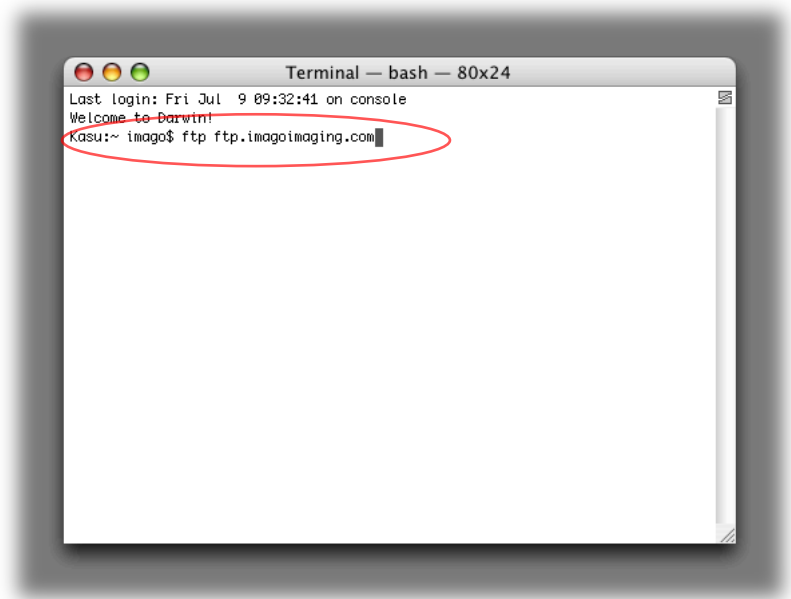


image 3a - Launching FTP software from the command line
